Understanding & Identifying Phishing Emails

GENERAL TIPS FOR RECOGNIZING A PHISHING SCHEME

- THINK BEFORE YOU CLICK
- CHECK FOR OVERLY GENERIC CONTENT OR GREETINGS
- EXAMINE THE ENTIRE "FROM" EMAIL ADDRESS
- LOOK FOR URGENCY OR DEMANDING ACTIONS
- CHECK THE LINK FIRST
- LOOK FOR MISSPELLINGS, INCORRECT GRAMMAR, LOGO DIFFERENCES, OR ODD PHRASING
- CHECK FOR SECURE WEBSITES
- AND IF ALL ELSE FAILS - DON'T CLICK!



First, you need to understand What Phishing Is

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Types of Phishing

DECEPTIVE PHISHING: ANY ATTACK BY WHICH FRAUDSTERS IMPERSONATE A LEGITIMATE COMPANY & ATTEMPT TO STEAL CREDENTIALS



SPEAR PHISHING: WHEN FRAUDSTERS CUSTOMIZE THEIR ATTACK EMAILS WITH THE TARGET'S PERSONAL INFO (PHONE #, TITLE, ETC.)



CEO FRAUD: TARGETING AN EXECUTIVE BY SENDING A FAKE EMAIL THAT LOOKS LIKE IT CAME FROM THE CEO OR ANOTHER COMPANY EXECUTIVE

BE A DETECTIVE

- Are you expecting an email from this person?
- Have you ever received an email request from this person?
- Does this email contain a "Call to Action" Click Bait Link?
- Is the email threatening in any way?
- Are there any misspellings? Company logo a different color?
- Does this email contain an attachment?

STOP - THINK - DETECT





Remember:
If it looks
suspicious -
It probably
is!



Make sure you read the full email address of the sender. If the email address looks suspicious, report it.



Stop - Don't Click that!
Any email with a file attachment should be considered suspicious until confirmed otherwise.

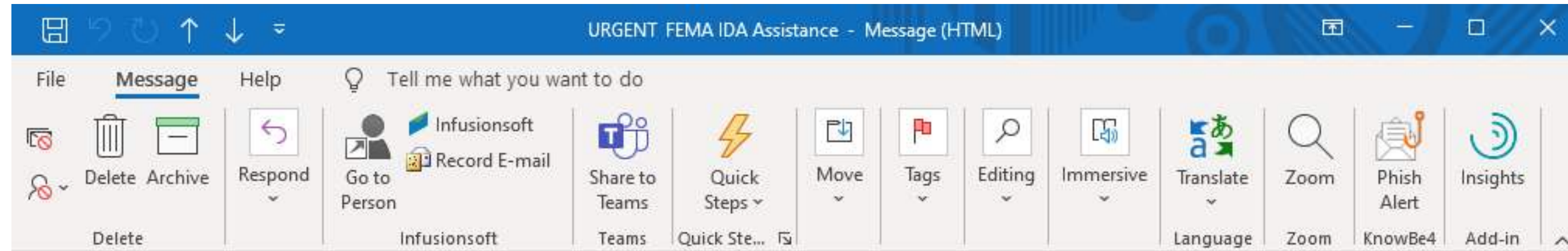


Hover over all URL links before clicking on them to make sure they are legitimate.

Verify a site's security by checking for the "https" URL with a closed lock icon





Hover your mouse over the link to reveal the real full link and verify that the address link is a legitimate

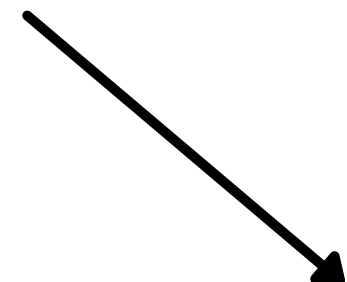
